502863 Introduction to English Literature

This course covers key novels, poems, and plays from Britain and the United States, providing a basic understanding and analysis of English literature. The course also prepares students for the teaching exam and aims to help students use these works in teaching English to middle and high school students through literature-based English education methods.

503036 Anglo-American Culture

This course examines works of English and American literature from the 19th and 20th centuries that have been adapted into films. Through a combination of reading key passages and watching films, students will explore the diverse and rich meanings of Anglo-American culture.

503117 Theories of English Education

This course comprehensively studies the latest theories in English education, covering the fundamentals of linguistics, psychology, and education, and providing students with various experiences based on different topics.

504849 Research and Methods of English Teaching Materials

This course explores how to organize educational materials more effectively and how to use the organized materials efficiently in English education.

503030 English Writing Skills and Logic

The ability to write effectively in English is fundamental to learning and is a crucial indicator of academic and professional success. This course provides an in-depth discussion of the theories and practices of second language writing skills and writing assessment.

503023 English Reading

This course develops basic English reading skills necessary for the information age by reading a variety of practical English texts. Students will also learn vocabulary and grammar while cultivating an understanding of Anglo-American culture.

503026 English Grammar

To enhance English sentence structure comprehension, this course focuses on learning basic sentence patterns with an emphasis on words and sentences. Students will learn the grammatical characteristics and usage of various sentence patterns, practicing content related to traditional grammar, such as nouns, verbs, tenses, etc., through examples.

503038 Methods of English Education

This course examines the methods of English education over time and helps students understand the linguistic and psychological principles underlying each method. Students will study these methods in detail, including the roles of teachers and learners, principles of teaching and learning, and the structure and techniques of teaching materials. The course also discusses how to apply these methods to current English education in Korea and encourages the development of integrated thinking skills for applying appropriate teaching methods to various educational

content. Students will explore ways to incorporate digital-age ICT teaching methods.

503037 English Prose Teaching Methods

This course explores how to improve vocabulary skills through the reading of various English prose and develops strategies to enhance reading comprehension through both intensive and extensive reading. Additionally, students will study teaching methods that foster overall comprehension through the analysis of English prose.

503031 English Phonetics and Phonology

This course explores questions such as: What are English sounds? Are they pronounced the same as by Korean speakers, or are there differences? What is the best way to learn, use, and teach these sounds? The course examines aspects of English phonetics and phonology, addressing both the structural elements of English sounds and their acoustic properties in second language acquisition.

503040 English Reading Teaching Methods

This course provides an intensive review of the theories and practices related to second language reading. The course will involve practical discussions on teaching methods and strategies for second language reading in various contexts.

503035 English Composition

This course focuses on practicing translating Korean into English. Students will be provided with examples of grammatical structures, idioms, and phrases, and practice translating Korean sentences into English using these examples.

503022 Introduction to English Linguistics

As the most fundamental course in English linguistics, this course covers the overall structure of English linguistics, including phonetics, phonology, morphology, syntax, semantics, pragmatics, and the history of the English language. It serves as an introductory course for linguistics research.

503027 English Conversation

This course covers low-intermediate to advanced English grammar for speaking. Students will participate in discussions and debates. All materials will be provided by the instructor.

503032 Foreign Language Education

This course provides an overview of how second language learners develop their language skills. The course also examines how second language learners interact with educational environments and how these learners achieve academic success and are assessed.
