502929 Logic

Logic is the study of reasoning and the laws of thought. It explores how to conduct correct reasoning without falling into errors.

502930 Ethics

This course examines issues of human nature and how the human soul is purified. It primarily covers the history of ethical thought, both as common knowledge and as preparatory knowledge for social life, divided into Western and Eastern perspectives.

502934 Epistemology

Epistemology encompasses theories of knowledge and logic. It analyzes epistemological issues to explore their application in philosophy education.

502050 Theory of Philosophy Subject Education

This course deals with the philosophical aspects of moral and ethics subjects in secondary schools. It systematically analyzes the content and structure of philosophy within these subjects, considering the challenges of philosophy education in modern society and exploring future directions.

502051 Studies of Teaching Materials and Method in Philosophy

After understanding the historical flow of Western philosophy, students learn methods to teach these concepts at a level appropriate for secondary school students.

502932 Metaphysics

Metaphysics is the most fundamental and comprehensive discipline seeking the ultimate grounds of all existence. This course explores how to apply metaphysics, the foundation of all philosophy and nature, to philosophy education.

506988 History of Eastern Philosophy

This course studies major philosophical classics, thoughts, and concepts from ancient China through the Wei, Jin, and Southern and Northern Dynasties within the context of Confucianism, Buddhism, and Taoism. It examines how these ideas influenced Song-Ming philosophy and explores key aspects of Korean Neo-Confucianism and Practical Learning.

506989 History of Western Philosophy

Students learn about the philosophical questions, concepts, and discussions that emerged during the dawn of Western philosophy. The course covers pre-Socratic natural philosophers, Plato and Aristotle's philosophies, Hellenistic philosophy, with a focus on Plotinus, the founder of Neoplatonism.

506990 Philosophy of Religion

This course aims to help students understand fundamental philosophical issues related to religion. Students philosophically examine key issues in religious experience and history, including the relationship between faith and reason, arguments for God's existence, the problem of evil, and religious language.

506991 Methodology of Philosophy Education

This course introduces students to various educational methodologies found in the Western philosophical tradition. It addresses fundamental pedagogical questions from diverse philosophical perspectives.

506992 Philosophical Anthropology

Philosophical anthropology provides critical reflection on human nature. Students learn various theories of human nature through philosophical perspectives and methodologies. The course covers topics such as understanding of humans in Western philosophy, time and space, existential situations, freedom, mind-body problem, and issues of desire and thought.
